1. takes a relaxed line, playing down US domestic criticism of the failure to achieve our objectives for SCR 1360. He hopes to learn more about the Russian position from next week.

2. said that would tell him when they met next week what lay behind the Russian position. Powell assumed it related to serious commercial problems:

3. But he judged that this would pass. The good news was that UNSC consensus for keeping current sanctions in place had been preserved for at least another five months; and there was a clear perception that the Russians were to blame for the impasse.

4. You said that the outcome of the draft resolution had not been a big story in the UK - though it had been the main subject of interest at your press briefing here earlier in the day. But in the region the Israeli/Palestinian situation made it harder to sustain our Iraq policy. agreed. Even the Saudis were venting their frustrations on the US. But Powell was confident that US friends in the region ultimately knew they had nowhere else to go.

5. I said that it would be important to keep working on the front-line states to win them over to our ideas. was confident that there were "embers" there, eg , which could be fanned at the appropriate time. But Powell had concluded in the run-up to the last rollover that change would be difficult for the front-line states. So he had eased up on them for now.
