**MEETING WITH THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, 23 JANUARY**

1. In advance of your meeting with the Attorney General on Thursday morning, I am sending you with this letter a DRAFT note of advice concerning resolution 1441. This note indicates the view which the Attorney has provisionally formed regarding the interpretation of the resolution, on the basis of the material supplied to him by the FCO, as contained in Michael Wood's letter of 9 December to me, which I believe you may have seen. Subsequent to that letter, the FCO also sent at my request copies of telegrams reporting the P5 discussions leading up to the adoption of the resolution.

2. The Attorney would welcome your comments on the view he has reached. In particular, he would be interested to know if you feel that there are any significant arguments which he has overlooked which would point to a different conclusion. The note has been passed by the Attorney to No. 10, but has not been circulated any more widely. I have been asked to stress that the note should not be copied further.
