SUBJECT: PERSONAL IRAQ: 10 FEBRUARY

This is the UKMIS/USUN draft referred to in MIPT.

BEGINS

The Security Council,

PP1: Recalling and reaffirming all its previous relevant resolutions, in particular its resolution 661 (1990) of August 1990, 678 (1990) of 29 November 1990, 686 (1991) of 2 March 1991, 687 (1991) of 3 April 1991, 688 (1991) of 5 April 1991, 986 (1995) of 14 April 1995, 1284 (1999) of 17 December 1999 and 1441 (2002) of 8 November 2003, and all relevant statements of its President,

PP2: Recalling the threat Iraq's noncompliance with Council resolutions and proliferation of weapons of mass destruction and long-range missiles poses to international peace and security,

PP3: Recalling that its resolution 678 (1990) authorized Member States to use all necessary means to uphold and implement its resolutions 660 (1990) of 2 August 1990 and all relevant resolutions subsequent to resolution 660 (1990) and to restore international peace and security in the area,

PP4: Recalling that in its resolution 1441 (2002) the Council

decided that Iraq has been and remains in material breach of its obligations under relevant resolutions, in particular through Iraq's failure to co-operate with United Nations inspectors and the IAEA, and to complete the actions required under paragraphs 8 to 13 of resolution 687 (1991),

PP5: Recalling that in its resolution 1441 (2002) Iraq was afforded a final opportunity to comply with its disarmament obligations under relevant resolutions of the Council,

PP6: Recalling that in its resolution 1441 (2002) the Council decided that false statements or omissions in the declarations submitted by Iraq pursuant to that resolution and failure by Iraq at any time to comply with, and cooperate fully in the implementation of that resolution shall constitute a further material breach of Iraq's obligations,

[PP7: Placeholder: Deeply concerned that, in their reports of 27 January and 14 February 2003, the Executive Chairman of UNMOVIC and the Director General of the IAEA made clear that Iraq has not co-operated fully with inspections nor addressed deficiencies in the declaration submitted by its pursuant to resolution 1441 (2002).]

PP8: Mindful of its primary responsibility under the Charter of the United Nations for the maintenance of international peace and security,

PP9: Determined to secure full compliance with its decisions and to restore international peace and security in the area,

PP10: Reaffirming the commitment of all Member States to the sovereignty and territorial integrity of Iraq, Kuwait and the neighbouring states,

PP11: Acting under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations,

OP1: Decides that Iraq's submission of a declaration containing false statements and omissions and continuing failure to comply with, and co-operate fully in the implementation of, resolution 1441 (2002) constitute a further material breach of Iraq's obligations under relevant resolutions of the Council and that Iraq accordingly has failed to take the final opportunity afforded to it by the Council in resolution 1441 (2002);

OP2: Reiterates that Iraq alone is fully responsible for the serious consequences it must now face as a result of its continued violation of its obligations under resolutions of the Council;

OP3: Decides to remain seized of the matter.
