BASRAH v. BAGHDAD? FACTORS

US Intent

- CFLCC main effort is Baghdad
- Franks main effort?

UK Intent

- Coalition Objectives (WMD etc)
- Political/Media/Humanitarian pressure

Intelligence Picture

- Situation unclear/confused
- Media add pressure not clarity
- Humanitarian situation not yet critical in Basrah
- Uprising or not? How many bad guys?
- Regime still in control

Options Focus on....

Baghdad

- CFLCC may need more forces
- 7 Armd Bde would take time to get there
- Coalition main effort
- Risks unattended disaster in Basrah

Basrah

- Success builds IO message 'a message to Baghdad'

but

- Divides the coalition effort

- 1 Div has insufficient forces to guarantee success (depends on situation – see int comments above)

Both

- Possibly keeps coalition focus
- But reduces effect on both (and likelihood of success)

Key Question

- When does political/media/humanitarian pressure (primarily on the UK) in Basrah reach the point at which it destabilises the coalition?
